* Literacy:

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
- Explore the reading area, using props, puppets to sing learned nursery rhymes.
- Use small world/various other role play props to retell previously learnt stories - 'The Jolly Christmas Postman'.
- Read a range of stories and identify characters, setting, order of the story and new vocabulary and apply this to play.
- Draw a story map to retell 'Can't you sleep little bear?'.
- Explore non-fiction books.
- Identify and name phase 2 and phase 3 sounds.
- Read individual letters and blend (CVC words) and begin to spell simple words by identifying sounds.
- Read words and simple phrases including some harder to read and spell words.
- Form letters correctly.
- Label a picture applying phonic knowledge.

Expressive Arts & Design:

- Explore, use and refine a variety of artistic effects to express their ideas and feelings.
- Return to and build on their previous learning, refining ideas and developing their ability to represent them.
- Explore how to use scissors and understand how sellotape and glue have different purposes.
- Using cutting, folding, twisting, bending material make a bear mask, lantern and a dragon.
- Sing and dance in a group increasingly matching the pitch and following the
