## Mutual Respect

We have an agreed set of school rules.

RE and collective worship allow us to show respect to others.

We celebrate and recognise events throughout the year (Eid, Hanukkah-celebrations in other religions)

We discuss current news stories- 'Newsround' and discuss any issues raised.

We have a range of class books on themes of equality and diversity.

## Rule of Law

We reflect and discuss our behaviour against the school rules.

We have a democratic process through the election of various committees such as School Council, Eco Council and Woodland Warriors.
